A few months ago, I provided an update on the Facility Stewardship Fund and the work of the Building and Grounds Team. Since then, a LOT has happened! In addition to the work in the attic of the church (primarily reinforcing rafters) that many of you knew had taken place, the new windows and exterior door along with some miscellaneous projects have been completed at the Parsonage. As I shared before, these projects will essentially wipe out the current FSF balance.

As I also shared before, the Buildings and Grounds Team is continuing to gather information on the parking lot and projects like the north entrance that will need to be addressed before we begin work on the actual parking lot.

In case you read the title and thought I was guilty of click bait, here's the BIG NEWS...after much prayer, deliberation, and consulting with the Buildings and

Grounds Team — the Local Board of Administration voted to recommend to the Local Church Conference that KWC sell the River House (formerly known as the Youth Parsonage). I'll share some of the reasoning behind this decision in a moment. Because the house/property technically belongs to the denomination, our district board also has to approve the sale. After I shared what led the church board to this decision with district leadership and answered their questions, they presented it to the district board. The district board voted unanimously to grant permission to KWC to move forward with the sale pending approval of the Local Church Conference.

So, what factored into this decision? As many of you know, the house has not been occupied for over four years and has only been used sparingly in those four years (despite efforts to make it available for missionaries and Wesleyan pastors) and we don't foresee hiring pastoral staff in the near future. Having a house continue to set empty while we continue to pay for utilities doesn't seem to be the best stewardship. We've also learned that most pastors prefer to be able to purchase or rent their own home instead of living in a parsonage. Another significant factor is that the Buildings and Grounds Team compiled a list of things that will need to be addressed at some point. While many of these items are not too costly, they estimate that the roof will need replaced in five years or so. The LBA and B&G team don't believe that it would be the best stewardship to invest the money needed to maintain this house moving forward. The final major factor that led the board to this decision is that selling the house (at a time when the market is high) would provide some much needed funding for buildings and property that are being used for ministry regularly — like the parking lot project. In case you're wondering, per denominational guidelines — funds from the sale of the house can only be used to purchase new property or to maintain/improve current facilities. The funds from the sale would also not be factored into USF (our denomination assessment).

Being someone who lived in the River House for eleven years, I know first hand how much of a blessing it has been and I'm extremely grateful for all who gave towards it's purchase and/or have given towards repairs and updates along with those who invested countless hours working on different projects at the house. As weird as it is to think of the church not owning it anymore, I do believe that God has brought KWC into a season where the best way to steward what God has given us and step into where's He's calling us is to sell it.
